RED STAG TUPUNGATO

World's largest stags in the foothills of the Andes

Owned by a pioneering Mendoza native, your hosts have been managing these Red Deer herds for the last 20 years. By introducing the best bloodlines from Europe and New Zealand, to the local stock, they have helped to foster some of the largest and healthiest herds in the country.

Guests will stay at the main ranch house, located adjacent to the hunting areas at the base of the foothills. For larger groups we also offer accommodations at different neighboring wineries, which have nice lodges and country hotels. This exclusive preserve spans over 20,000 acres and sits on the mid to upper levels of a vast ranch (150,000 acres). The fertile valleys of the Mendoza Andean foothills provide great habitat for deer, giving them the nutrition they need to develop impressive racks, with some specimens naturally reaching the 400 SCI+ class. Typically, stags of this size are only found in breeding farms in New Zealand and Europe.

WHY CHOOSE RED STAG TUPUNGATO?

- Red Stag Tupungato is the premiere stag hunting venue in Argentina, offering some of the healthiest, most impressive herds in the world. Through more than 20 years of careful management, it is not uncommon to see many huge, heavy racked stags each day of your hunt.
- Professional, english speaking guides, with an extensive knowledge of both the area and the animals will host you during your hunt. Locating and glassing animals in order to find the best, mature specimens for you to pursue.
- In addition to the Red Stag, you may also have opportunities to pursue Fallow Deer and Wild Eurasian Boar during your stay. The native wild game abounds, with Wild Guanaco, Puma, Andean Condor, and a number of other bird species often viewed on the ranch.
- Tupungato is one of the largest and oldest working ranches in western Argentina, you will be treated to the best in locally sourced cuisine, much of which is grown right on the property. World renown Argentine beef, paired with incredible wines from some of the best wineries in all of Argentina, all of which are sourced nearby.
- This 150,000+ acre ranch stretches from the Uco Valley below, all the way to the highest peaks of the Andes right on the Chilean border. Whether you are down in the valley, or up near the highest peaks of the ranch, amazing views abound, with some of the highest peaks (20,000 ft) in the South American Continent located right within the ranch.
- Horseback riding, trout fishing, winery tours and more are available for non-hunting companions, or after you take your stag.

LOCATION

The ranch is located in the Tupungato region of Mendoza province on Western Argentina, only 85 Kilometers (50 miles) south of the Mendoza city airport. It's one of the biggest and oldest working ranches in this part of the country. Its 150.000 acres property that goes from the Uco Valley all the way to the highest peaks of the Andes right in the border with Chile. The ranch has amazing views of the Uco Valley where some of the best winerys in all of Argentina are located, also some of the highest peaks in the South American continent are within the ranches boundaries, with a couple over 20.000 ft. The views are stunning!

GETTING THERE

To get to the lodge you need to fly into Buenos Aires (Ezeiza Intl. Airport – EZE), which is served with daily direct flights from many U.S. or European cities. Once there, you'll transfer to the domestic airport Aeroparque Jorge Newbery – AEP (40' to 1 hr drive), and take a 1:45 min flight to Mendoza Airport (MDZ). Another option is to fly via Santiago de Chile (45 min flight).

Hunters will then be picked up at the airport by the lodge staff, and transferred to the lodge, along roads with stunning views of the Andes Mountains to the west. The drive takes 1 hour approx.

FACILITIES AND SERVICES

The main ranch house offers a selection of single and double guest rooms, as well as a comfortable living room, along with an outdoor dining area and a lovely formal dining room. At the base of the ranch, below the foothills, the family operates an active farm, producing potatoes, cherries, walnuts and award winning wines. The property is set against a spectacular backdrop of some of the highest peaks in the Andes, with Mount Tupungato, one of the highest volcanoes in the world, visible from every corner of the ranch. The perfect venue for couples as well, Red Stag Tupungato offers a variety of non-hunting activities, including wine tours, trout fishing and horseback riding for interested guests and groups.

For larger parties, The Atamisque Lodge (our other lodging option) offers beautifully appointed guest suites, with dining and sitting areas for you to enjoy and relax after long days stalking red stag.

- Capacity: The ranch lodge has capacity for 4 hunters at the same time or 3 couples. At the winery lodge we can accommodate up to 10 guests.
- WiFi Internet access and satellite TV.
- Our talented chefs will prepare delicious menu options including Argentina's famed asados and fine wines, locally sourced fruits and vegetables, and more.

Griffin & Howe, we can offer their Highlander Rifles in 300 Win Mag, as well as a collection of Remington, Sako & Styer rifles in various calibers as well. All guns sport high quality optics including Zeiss, Swarovski, Schmith & Bender, etc.

- After the hunt we take care of the preparation and paperwork for the trophy export.
- There are several non-hunting activities like horseback riding, hiking, sightseeing tours, birdwatching, trout fishing, etc. Some of the best wineries in the country are in the area, so half or full day wine tours can be arranged.

THE HUNTING

The Red Stag Tupungato hunting program is focused on providing the best fair chase opportunities on some of the most impressive red stags in South America. Most mornings will find you up well before dawn. After a hot breakfast, you and your guide (1x1) will depart by 4 wheel drive truck, or side by side for the hunting area, located up in the foothills of the mountains. Horses may also be used, depending upon the locations the guide have scouted the big stags in, along with your preferences.

Drives to the hunting area range from 15 to 40 minutes, depending on where the animals have been scouted. Spotting and stalking is the most common method of hunting for rifle hunters. Archery hunters may also spend some time sitting over wallows and watering areas, awaiting the stag to come in. The hunting can be arranged to include hikes into high country looking for lonely big stags or sitting in a blind overlooking a wallow in the valleys or river bottoms.

In addition to the finest red stag hunting in South America, the ranch has a growing population of fallow deer and every season some beautiful bucks are harvested. Pure wild European boar thrive as well in this area—a great addition to the deer.



DAILY ITINERARY

Morning will begin with a wake up call, approximately an hour before departure time. Breakfast will be served shortly thereafter, with everything from waffles to Eggs Benedict, all made to order. Hunters will depart the lodge well before sunrise. Drives vary depending on conditions, but range from fifteen to forty five minutes.

You may return to the lodge for lunch, and some time to relax, or enjoy a siesta or lunch right in the field. Hunters will again depart for their afternoon hunt around 2 to 3pm.

Evening hunts last until nearly dark, allowing enough light to safely get down from the mountains, after which you will return to the lodge, where you will be met with cocktails and appetizers as well a delicious dinner, before retiring for the evening.



RED DEER

Red Deer are fairly new to this part of the country, as compared to Patagonia. Around 30 years ago some small herds started to show up in the area migrating from the south. Those first wanderers plus the introduction of pure bloodlines from New Zealand and Europe and a perfect endless habitat, produce in this part of the Andes mountains a Red Stag Heaven.

Good, strict management contributed to having today the best herds of Red Stags in the country in terms of quality, health, and beauty.

FALLOW DEER

Fallow Deer were introduced into Argentina around the 1900s, first in northwestern Patagonia and then in other locations around the country. Years later some were taken into Chile. Chileans implemented good management of the herd, improving on original bloodlines, and have managed to produce the largest Fallow Deer bucks of South America.

In the 70s some of the deer were transported from Patagonia to a ranch not far from ours in Mendoza, where they flourished, expanding their range over time. Around 10 years ago we started a Fallow Deer breeding program in order to improve the local wild herds. Bloodlines from Chile and Europe were brought in, and by mixing them with the healthy local stock, we had great success in improving the deer antler growth and trophy quality.



WILD BOAR

Wild Boar (Sus Scrofa) was the first non-native game animal introduced in Argentina by the early Spanish conquistadores. Later in the 19th century, pure Eurasian boars were introduced in Patagonia and central Argentina, rapidly expanding through major areas of the country. They arrived to the foothills of the Andes not long ago, coming from southern Mendoza and northern Patagonia. Today the area boasts a great population of pure wild European boars, which are seen regularly during the stag hunts, with bigger boars commonly seen later in the season.

To ensure the best experience, it's important to choose the type of stag you wish to pursue at the time of booking. If you're aiming for a big trophy, we highly recommend pre-paying for it. This allows us to assign a dedicated team of guides to conduct extensive pre-scouting of the ranch before your arrival.

Given the size of the property, along with factors like unpredictable weather, a week of hunting may not always be enough to locate and pursue the largest stags. By scouting in advance, we can identify their locations and movement patterns, ensuring you're set up for the best possible experience. Regardless of the size of the stag included in your booking, if you harvest a larger one during your hunt, you'll have the option to upgrade. The additional cost will be adjusted according to our trophy fee list, which will be settled upon checkout.
